Dear Parent or Guardian:

The 2022-2023 school year began the revision of the New Jersey State Learning Standards in Comprehensive Health and Physical Education mandated by the NJ Department of Education. We value the importance of partnering with families as we educate students in the knowledge and skills they need in order to lead a healthy, active life.

Family Life and Social/Sexual Health Instruction topics will be taught in **grades 2, 5, 7 and 8**. The <u>curriculum guides</u> are available on the district website for your review. Our curriculum has been reviewed and approved as appropriate to the age, maturity, growth and development of students at each grade level.

Franklin Township School District acknowledges that parents/guardians are the primary sexuality educators for their child/children. We want to remind Parents/Guardians that they do have the option of excluding their child from any Family Life/Social/Sexual Health instruction if it is in conflict with conscience, moral, or religious beliefs. Students who are excused will be assigned to a separate classroom for the identified lessons and complete independent work on previously taught health topics such as nutrition, first aid, communication skills, substance abuse, etc.

Below is a tentative timeline of when to expect Family Life parent letters this school year. Grade 2 and 5 instruction will occur in the spring. Grade 7 and 8 instruction will occur during the winter. Instruction will be provided by Mr. Hunter Timko, PE/Health teacher and Mrs. Ann Teitelbaum, our school nurse.
