FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP SUMMER FUN PROGRAM 2014

AFTER CARE Program-- offered daily through both summer recreation and Summer Fun Programs, at an hourly rate of \$2.00 per hour per student. A minimum of 8 students will be required to hold aftercare programs. After care 12:30 – 4:30 p.m. This after care is offered at \$2.00 per hour (for any part thereof.) Time must be scheduled in advance.

Schedule for after care will be 30 - 45 min. lunch time/social time, followed by 30 - 45 min. free play time outside, weather permitting; activities will include group games, board games, ping pong; for remaining time activities will include, but not be limited to: arts and crafts, mask making, puppet making, painting, film and video exploration, storytelling, acting, etc. Payment for this program shall be paid separately, by week, in advance of the program.

Course Title: ROCKET MAN

Description: Do you like custom made rockets or air cars? How about making cement canoes, truss bridges or trebuchets? In this class students will learn to design, test and redesign for improvements, while collaborating and sharing with peers to make exciting and challenging engineering projects.
