Collaborative Engineering Project

Every year fifth grade students at Franklin Township School participate in a cross curricular activity between the STEM and Art classes. During this cross-curricular lesson, students learn what a dragster is, the engineering principles behind the dragster, and industrial design. Working in partner groups, students complete the engineering design process to create a CO2 car.

During the building process, students are able to see a dragster up close and personal. Mr. Joe Morrison from Right2Breathe comes to Franklin Township School and conducts an interview. Students ask Mr. Morrison questions about his car, aerodynamics, and the nonprofit organization Right2Breathe. Students learn about BMW art cars and paint their cars, using a budget, by applying the concepts learned. After the interview and the construction of the cars are complete, parents and community members come to support our students on race day!

Students race their cars to see which homeroom built the fastest cars. Students are excited to meet Mr. Morrison on May 11, 2017. This is an event that is truly enjoyed by all, and the teachers and administration are proud to recognize the truly collaborative nature of the project.
