VI. Interim Superintendent's Report - Dr. Davis

A. Informational/Discussion Items:

- 1. Student Delegate Grace French-Grace brought the plaque for the time capsule to be presented by the eight grade class, and the board viewed it prior to installation. Grace conducted surveys about uniforms. 50% of students polled said yes, they want uniforms or did not care. 50% were strongly opposed. If there was a club or elective, 6th graders wanted more art time.. Many older students wanted more sports time. 3 years ago, more electives were added for the week. Mr. Lembo did exercising with technology on the wii or x-box, and students requested it back. Grace described the softball team and coach Larsen-she felt that she learned a lot, worked hard, and had a lot of fun. Dr. Davis reported that 13 girls started and ended, but they stayed together and won a game. Students have been completing class registration for North next year; many students are signed up for honors and sports such as gymnastics team, track, softball, and most students are excited to do sports in high school.
