ORDINANCE NO. 08-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, CHAPTER 61, "ANIMALS", ARTICLE II, "CATS"

SECTION ONE: Chapter 61 "Animals", Article II "Cats", Section 61-12 "Vaccination and license required", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright is hereby amended as follows:

§61-12 Vaccination and license required.

A. Vaccination and license requirements. No person shall own, keep, harbor, or maintain any cat over seven months of age within the Borough of Sea Bright unless such cat is vaccinated and licensed against rabies.

SECTION TWO: Chapter 61 "Animals", Article II "Cats", Section 61-13 "Licensing procedure", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright shall be deleted in its entirety.

SECTION THREE: Chapter 61 "Animals", Article II "Cats", Section 61-14 "Restraint required", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright is hereby amended as follows:

§61-14 Restraint required.

No cat, either licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted to run at large off the premises of the person owning or having the care, custody or control of the cat or to trespass upon the property of any other resident of the Borough.

SECTION FOUR: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION FIVE: If any section, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the reminder of this Ordinance.

SECTION SIX: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 09-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF SEA BRIGHT AMENDING CHAPTER 130, "LAND USE", OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT TO PERMIT THE OPERATION OF ONE CLASS 5 CANNABIS RETAIL BUSINESS WITHIN ITS GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, in 2020 New Jersey voters approved Public Question No. 1, which amended the New Jersey Constitution to allow for the legalization of a controlled form of marijuana called "cannabis" for adults at least 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes six marketplace classes of licensed businesses, consisting of:

- Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
- Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
- Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
- Class 4 Cannabis Distributor license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from one licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
- Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and
- Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer
 purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the
 purchased items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to
 make a purchase directly through the cannabis delivery service which would be presented by
 the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

WHEREAS, Section 3 of the Act defines a "cannabis establishment" as "a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer;" and

WHEREAS, Section 31a of the Act also authorizes municipalities to adopt by ordinance regulations governing the number of (1) cannabis establishments, (2) cannabis distributors and (3) cannabis delivery services, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a cannabis delivery service based and initiated from outside of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Section 31a of the Act also authorizes municipalities to adopt by ordinance regulations governing the local licensing endorsement, location, manner and times of operation of cannabis establishments and cannabis distributors, and the location and manner of cannabis delivery services, and establishing civil penalties for the violation of any such regulations; and

WHEREAS, Section 31b of the Act authorizes municipalities to prohibit by ordinance the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishments, distributors, or delivery services anywhere in the municipality, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a delivery service based and initiated from outside of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Section 31b of the Act also stipulates, however, that any municipal regulation or prohibition must be adopted within 180 days of the effective date of the Act (i.e., by August 21, 2021); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 31b of the Act, the failure to do so shall mean that for a period of five years thereafter, the growing, cultivating, manufacturing, selling and reselling of cannabis and cannabis items shall be permitted uses in all industrial zones, and the retail selling of cannabis items to consumers shall be a conditional use in all commercial and retail zones; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the initial and any subsequent five-year period following a failure to enact local regulations or prohibitions, the municipality shall again, in 2026, have 180 days to adopt an ordinance regulating or prohibiting cannabis businesses, but any such ordinance would be prospective only and would not apply to any cannabis business already operating with appropriate approvals within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of Sea Bright has determined that it is at this time necessary and appropriate, and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of Sea Bright's residents and members of the public who visit, travel, or conduct business in Sea Bright, to amend Sea Bright's regulation to prohibit Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator licenses; Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer licenses; Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler licenses; Class 4 Cannabis Distributor Licenses; and Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Licenses. The Borough of Sea Bright will permit one Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license to operate in the Borough of Sea Bright B-1 Central Business Zones subject to any limitations and restrictions stated herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Article II, "Definitions," of Chapter 130,"Land Use",of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following definitions:

"Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator

Any licensed person or entity that grows, cultivates, or produces cannabis in this State, and sells, and may transport, this cannabis to other cannabis cultivators, or usable cannabis to cannabis manufacturers, cannabis wholesalers, or cannabis retailers, but not to consumers."

"Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer

Any licensed person or entity that processes cannabis items in this State by purchasing or otherwise obtaining usable cannabis, manufacturing, preparing, and packaging cannabis items, and selling, and optionally transporting, these items to other cannabis manufacturers, cannabis wholesalers, or cannabis retailers, but not to consumers."

"Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler

Any licensed person or entity that purchases or otherwise obtains, stores, sells or otherwise transfers, and may transport, cannabis items for the purpose of resale or other transfer to either another cannabis wholesaler or to a cannabis retailer, but not to consumers."

"Class 4 Cannabis Distributor

Any licensed person or entity that transports cannabis in bulk intrastate from one licensed cannabis cultivator to another licensed cannabis cultivator, or transports cannabis items in bulk intrastate from any one class of licensed cannabis establishment to another class of licensed cannabis establishment and may engage in the temporary storage of cannabis or cannabis items as necessary to carry out transportation activities."

"Class 5 Cannabis Retail Store

The premises at which cannabis items are retailed, which may include purchase orders for off-premises delivery by a certified cannabis handler working for or on behalf of the cannabis retailer, or consumer purchases to be fulfilled from the retail premises that are presented by a cannabis delivery service with a Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Service license and which will be delivered by the cannabis delivery service to that consumer. The sale of anything, except cannabis, as well as the service and sale of food are strictly prohibited."

"Class 6 Cannabis Delivery

Any licensed person or entity that provides courier services for consumer purchases of cannabis items and related supplies fulfilled by a cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the cannabis items and related supplies to that consumer, and which services include the ability of a consumer to purchase the cannabis items directly through the cannabis delivery service, which after presenting the purchase order to the cannabis retailer for fulfillment, is delivered to that consumer."

"Consumption Area

A designated location operated by a licensed cannabis retailer, for which both a State and local endorsement has been obtained, that is either: (1) an indoor, structurally enclosed area of the cannabis retailer or permit holder that is separate from the area in which retail sales of cannabis items or the dispensing of medical cannabis occurs; or (2) an exterior structure on the same premises as the cannabis retailer, either separate from or connected to the cannabis retailer, at which cannabis items obtained from the retailer, or brought by a person to the consumption area, may be consumed."

SECTION 2. Article VII, "Area, Bulk and Use Requirements," of Chapter 130,"Land Use", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Section 130-29, "Regulations applicable to all zones," is hereby amended and supplemented by the addition thereto of the following subsections:

- "P. Pursuant to section 31b of the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act (P.L. 2021, c. 16), all Class 1 Cannabis Cultivation, Class 2 Cannabis Manufacture, Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler, Class 4 Cannabis Distributor, and Class 6 Cannabis Delivery licensees are hereby prohibited from operating anywhere in the Borough of Sea Bright. Moreover, indoor and exterior cannabis consumption areas are hereby prohibited within the Borough of Sea Bright."
- "Q. Any Class 5 Cannabis Retail store permitted to operate within the Borough of Sea Bright is prohibited from engaging in the sale of food and prohibited from allowing customers to bring outside food into the establishment. A Class 5 Cannabis Retail store is prohibited from engaging in the sale of any item except for cannabis. No Class 5 Cannabis Retail store shall permit any smoking of cannabis products within the store, and no such store shall have any indoor or outdoor consumption area. A Class 5 Cannabis Retail store shall not provide seating in the store for customers."

SECTION 3. Article VII, "Area, Bulk and Use Requirements," of Chapter 130, "Land Use", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Section 130-38, "Uses Permitted," subsection 130-38B." Certain uses defined.", subparagraph 130-38B.(2)(a), "Class II, retail business uses" is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

"(a) Type No. 1: food, drug, liquor stores, <u>and one Class 5 Cannabis retail store</u>. This also includes lunch counters, sandwich shops, soda fountains and confectionary stores."

SECTION 4. Article VII, "Area, Bulk and Use Requirements," of Chapter 130,"Land Use", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Section 130-38, "Uses Permitted," subsection 130-38C."Use regulations.", subparagraph 130-38C.(4) (a){2}," Class II, retail business uses. Type of use" is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

[a] Food, drug, liquor stores, and one Class 5 Cannabis Retail Store.			
[b] Apparel, accessory and jewelry shops.			
[c] Department stores and mail order houses.			
[d] Variety stores (five-and-ten-cent stores and catalog stores).			
[f] Restaurants.			
[g] Book, stationery, and gift shops.			
[h] Sporting goods and bicycle shops.			
[i] Antique stores (and secondhand shops).			
[k] Automotive accessory stores			
[I] Boating and fishing accessory stores.			
[m] Internet café."

ORDINANCE NO. 10-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 146, "NUISANCES", OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT TO ADD THERETO A NEW ARTICLE III, "SMOKING REGULATIONS."

SECTION ONE. Chapter 146, "Nuisances", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright be and the same is hereby amended to add thereto the following new Article:

ARTICLE III: Smoking Regulations

§ 146-13 <u>Findings</u>.

The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright hereby finds and determines that:

- i. The smoking of tobacco products is a major contributor to air pollution and breathing in secondhand smoke is a cause of disease to nonsmokers;
- The United States Department of Environmental Protection (EPA) has designated secondhand smoke as a Class A carcinogen, as well as a significant cause of respiratory problems in children;
- iii. In 1986 the United States Surgeon General found that the active smoking of tobacco products and the passive inhalation of environmental tobacco smoke are the most prevalent causes of preventable death, disease and disability;
- iv. The United States Surgeon General found that separating smokers from nonsmokers within the same air space does not eliminate the exposure of nonsmokers to environmental tobacco smoke;
- v. The New Jersey Legislature found and declared that tobacco is the leading cause of preventable disease and death in the State of New Jersey and the nation and tobacco smoke constitutes a substantial health hazard to the nonsmoking majority of the public;
- vi. The State of New Jersey has acknowledged that careless smoking is the leading cause of death from fire;
- vii. Smoking leads to the inevitable discard of tobacco products and a source of litter by those who fail to properly dispose of cigarettes;
- viii. The State of New Jersey entered into litigation against various tobacco product manufacturers and others for the purpose of improving the public's health and adopting policies and programs to achieve a significant reduction in smoking by its citizens, and in particular, by youth and, as part of a settlement, the State of New Jersey received significant funding for the advancement of public health, including the implementation of important tobacco-related public health measures and restrictions.

- ix. In 2006, the Legislature enacted the New Jersey Smoke Free Air Act, N.J.S.A. 26:3D-55 et seq., creating an outright ban on smoking in virtually all public indoor facilities and extending such ban to the grounds of any public or nonpublic elementary or secondary school, regardless of whether the area is an indoor or outdoor public place and expanded same in 2019 to include public beaches and parks; and
- x. The Legislature has deemed the control of smoking to be a necessary and proper exercise of municipal authority pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-1 et seq., 40:48-2 et seq., and N.J.S.A. 2C:33-13 for the preservation of public health, safety and welfare of the community.

§ 146-14 <u>Definitions</u>.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (1) "Beach" means the gentle sloping of sand adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean in the Borough of Sea Bright that extends landward from the mean high waterline of the ocean to a man-made feature generally parallel to the ocean, such as a seawall, fence, parking lot, retaining wall or other structure, whichever is closest to the ocean. "Beach" shall include supervised beaches, unsupervised beaches, private beaches, beach clubs, beach access, dunes, foreshore and the Atlantic Ocean as defined herein.
- (2) "Electronic smoking device" means an electronic device that can be used to deliver nicotine or other substance to that person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electric cigarette, cigar, cigarillo, or pipe.
- (3) "Indoor public place" means a structurally enclosed place of business, commerce or other service-related activity, whether publicly or privately owned or operated on a forprofit or nonprofit basis, which is generally accessible to the public, including, but not limited to: a commercial or other office building; office or building owned, leased or rented by the State or by a county or municipal government; public and nonpublic elementary or secondary school building; board of education building; theater or concert hall; public library; museum or art gallery; bar; restaurant or other establishment where the principal business is the sale of food for consumption on the premises, including the bar area of the establishment; garage or parking facility; any public conveyance operated on land or water, or in the air, and passenger waiting rooms and platform areas in any stations or terminals thereof; health care facility licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, c. 136 (C.26:21-1-1 et seq.); patient waiting room of the office of a health care provider licensed pursuant to Title 45 of the Revised Statutes; child care center licensed pursuant to P.L.1983, c. 492 (C.30:5B-1 et seq.); race track facility; facility used for the holding of sporting events; ambulatory recreational facility; shopping mall or retail store; hotel, motel or other lodging establishment; apartment building lobby or other public area in an otherwise private building; or a passenger elevator in a building other than a singlefamily dwelling.

- (4) "Park" means any athletic fields, playgrounds and other active and passive recreation areas primarily of service to youth, owned, leased, operated or under the ownership control of the Borough of Sea Bright to which the general public is invited and youth under the age of 18 may gather.
- (5) "Person" means any individual, partnership, cooperative association, private corporation, personal representative, receiver, trustee, assignee or any other legal entity.
- (6) "Public Building" means Any building, structure, facility or complex, including appurtenant parking areas, owned, leased, operated or under the ownership control of the Borough of Sea Bright to which the general public is invited.
- (7) "Smoking" means burning of, inhaling from, exhaling the smoke from, or the possession of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, hookah or similar device, or any other device which contains tobacco or any other matter that can be smoked, or the inhaling or exhaling of smoke or vapor from an electronic smoking device.
- (8) "Workplace" means a structurally enclosed location or portion thereof at which a person performs any type of service or labor.

§ 146-15 <u>Restrictions</u>.

- (1) Smoking shall be prohibited by any person, regardless of age, in all public parks, beaches and recreation facilities owned or leased by the Borough of Sea Bright, including that land upon which the public is invited or upon which the public is permitted and where individuals gather for recreation activities, including all areas adjacent to such facilities, including, but not limited to, parking areas, driveways or drive aisles, which have been designated by no-smoking signs and which are hereafter designated as "Smoke and Tobacco Free Places."
- (2) Smoking shall be prohibited by any person, regardless of age, in any indoor public place, or workplace within the Borough of Sea Bright.
- (3) No person shall smoke a cigarette, cigar, electronic smoking device or any other materials by any means in the beachfront area, entire beachwalk and all access ramps that lead to the beachwalk at any time.
- § 146-16 <u>Signs</u>. Signs shall be clearly, sufficiently, and conspicuously posted where smoking is prohibited by this section. The signs shall state "NO SMOKING," and/or contain the international no-smoking symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a diagonal red line through its cross section).
- § 146-17 <u>Enforcement</u>. The Sea Bright Police Department and any municipal officer charged with code enforcement is hereby charged with enforcement of this Article. Further, the person having control over an indoor public place or workplace shall order any person smoking in violation of this section to comply with the ordinance.

§ 146-18 <u>Penalty</u>. Anyone who smokes in violation of this ordinance is subject to a fine of \$200.00.

SECTION TWO. All other provisions of § 146, "Nuisance," remain unchanged and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION THREE. All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION FOUR. Should any section, paragraph, clause or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 11-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF SEA BRIGHT AMENDING CHAPTER 130, "LAND USE," OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT TO PROHIBIT THE OPERATION OF ALL CLASSES OF CANNABIS ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN ITS GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES AND THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

WHEREAS, in 2020 New Jersey voters approved Public Question No. 1, which amended the New Jersey Constitution to allow for the legalization of a controlled form of marijuana called "cannabis" for adults at least 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes six marketplace classes of licensed businesses, including:

- Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
- Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
- Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
- Class 4 Cannabis Distributer license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from on licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
- Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and
- Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the purchases items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to make a purchase directly through the cannabis delivery service which would be presented by the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to adopt regulations governing the number of cannabis establishments (defined in section 3 of the Act as "a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer"), cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services allowed to operate within their boundaries, as well as the location manner and times operation of such establishments, distributors or delivery services, and establishing civil penalties for the violation of any such regulations; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to prohibit the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishments, distributors, or delivery services anywhere in the municipality; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act also stipulates, however, that any municipal regulation or prohibition must be adopted within 180 days of the effective date of the Act (i.e., by August 22, 2021); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 31b of the Act, the failure to do so shall mean that for a period of five years thereafter, the growing, cultivating, manufacturing, selling and reselling of cannabis and cannabis items shall be permitted uses in all industrial zones, and the retail selling of cannabis items to consumers shall be a conditional use in all commercial and retail zones; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the initial and any subsequent five-year period following a failure to enact local regulations or prohibitions, the municipality shall again have 180 days to adopt an ordinance regulating or prohibiting cannabis businesses, but any such ordinance would be prospective only and would not apply to any cannabis business already operating within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright has determined that, due to present uncertainties regarding the potential future impacts that allowing one or more classes of cannabis business might have on New Jersey municipalities in general, and on the Borough of Sea Bright in particular, it is at this time necessary and appropriate, and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the Borough of Sea Bright's residents and members of the public who visit, travel, or conduct business in the Borough of Sea Bright, to amend the Borough of Sea Bright's zoning regulations to prohibit all manner of marijuana-related land use and development within the geographic boundaries of the Borough of Sea Bright; and

WHEREAS, due to the complexity and novelty of the Act; the many areas of municipal law that are or may be implicated in decisions as to whether or to what extent cannabis or medical cannabis should be permitted for land use purposes or otherwise regulated in any particular municipality; and the relatively short duration in which the Act would allow such decisions to be made before imposing an automatic authorization of such uses in specified zoning districts subject to unspecified conditions, the most prudent course of action for all municipalities, whether or not generally in favor of cannabis or medical cannabis land development and uses, would be to prohibit all such uses within the Act's 180-day period in order to ensure sufficient time to carefully review all aspects of the Act and its impacts;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to section 31b of the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act (P.L. 2021, c. 16), all cannabis establishments, cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services are hereby prohibited from operating anywhere in the Borough of Sea Bright, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a delivery service.
- 2. Article VII, "Area, Bulk and Use Requirements," of Chapter 130, "Land Use," of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Section 130-38, "Uses Permitted," subsection G, "Prohibited Uses," is hereby amended by adding to the list of prohibited uses, the following: "All classes of cannabis establishments or cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services as said terms are defined in section 3 of P.L. 2021, c. 16, but not the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a delivery service."
- 3. Any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- 4. If any section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.
- 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication according to the law.
