No. 158-2024 Supporting the Withdrawal of Sea Bright Students from the Oceanport and Shore Regional School District to Join the Henry Hudson Regional School District

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Bieber:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright ("Sea Bright") is a member of the consolidated Oceanport School District ("Oceanport") pursuant to a 2009 mandatory merger under P.L. 2009, c. 78 (eliminating non-operating school districts) and, by virtue of that membership, students residing in Sea Bright in grades PK-8 are educated in schools operated by Oceanport; and

WHEREAS, Sea Bright is a constituent member of a limited purpose regional school district, Shore Regional High School District ("Shore Regional"), whereby students residing in Sea Bright in grades 9-12 are educated in schools operated by Shore Regional; and

WHEREAS, Sea Bright, the Borough of Highlands ("Highlands"), and the Borough of Atlantic Highlands ("Atlantic Highlands") wished to determine the viability and impact of a proposed school district reconfiguration whereby a new All-Purpose PK-12 Regional School District would be created with Sea Bright, Atlantic Highlands, and Highlands as constituent districts of this new district and which would educate all students residing in the three communities in grades PK-12;

WHEREAS, in an effort to explore this proposed school district reconfiguration, Sea Bright, Highlands, and Atlantic Highlands retained Porzio, Bromberg, & Newman, P.C., to facilitate a feasibility study that was issued in March 2020 and updated in January 2022 and which analyzed the financial, demographic, and educational impact of creating a new All-Purpose PK-12 regional school district which would be responsible for educating students residing in Sea Bright, Highlands, and Atlantic Highlands; and

WHEREAS, with regard to educational impact, the feasibility study concluded that "[t]he All-Purpose PK-12 Regional District will present distinct advantages" for students from Sea Bright, Highlands, and Atlantic Highlands "as opposed to the status quo given the degree of cooperation, alignment and articulation possible through a unified district from PK-12 in areas of curriculum, instruction, student services, transitions, enrichment, athletics and clubs, governance and leadership;" and

WHEREAS, with regard to the financial impact of the possible reconfiguration, the feasibility study concluded that "the increased financial resources that Sea Bright students will bring to the regional district provides the opportunity for greater investments in education resources, programs and services" while still providing long-term tax savings to Sea Bright and moving "to an arguably fairer and more equitable allocation of cost methodology" for all three communities; and

WHEREAS, Sea Bright joined with the Boroughs of Highlands and Atlantic Highlands and the Boards of Education of Highlands, Atlantic Highlands and Henry Hudson Regional to petition the Commissioner of Education to authorize a referendum on the expansion of Henry Hudson Regional into an all-purpose PK-12 regional school district and to allow Sea Bright to join this PK-12 regional; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Education authorized a referendum on the expansion of Henry Hudson into an all-purpose PK-12 regional school district with Highlands and Atlantic Highlands; and

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2023, the Commissioner of Education determined that Sea Bright was eligible under Section 11(a) of P.L 2021, c.402, N.J.S.A. 18A:13-47.1 *et seq.* to petition for authorization to withdraw from Shore Regional and Oceanport in the event that the referendum to expand Henry Hudson were to pass; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2023, the voters in Highlands and Atlantic Highlands approved the expansion of Henry Hudson into an all-purpose PK-12 regional school district and that expansion was effectuated on July 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, at the same time, Sea Bright and Highlands commissioned an update to the above feasibility studies to include analysis of the specific items set forth in N.J.S.A. 18A:13-47.11 such that an amended petition could be filed with the Commissioner of Education; and

WHEREAS, that supplemental feasibility study concluded that all elements of N.J.S.A. 18A:13-47.11 will be met in the event that Sea Bright is permitted to withdraw from Shore Regional and Oceanport and join Henry Hudson as a constituent member of the Henry Hudson all-purpose PK-12 regional school district; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, after due consideration, Sea Bright continues to believe that its students can receive an outstanding and fully aligned and articulated PK-12 education by becoming a constituent member of Henry Hudson; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Bright has determined that there exists good cause to pursue authorization from the Commissioner to withdraw from Shore Regional and Oceanport, and upon such authorization, to hold a referendum to allow the voters in Sea Bright to determine whether Sea Bright should join Henry Hudson; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Bright seeks to have a referendum placed on the November 2024 ballot, or as soon thereafter as possible, with regard to its joining Henry Hudson as a constituent member, which, upon passage, would result as a matter of law in its withdrawal from Oceanport and Shore Regional; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Bright authorized and continues to authorize the filing of a petition with the Commissioner of Education seeking authorization for its withdrawal from Shore Regional and Oceanport upon successful passage of a referendum on its joining Henry Hudson as a constituent member; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Bright authorizes special counsel, Porzio, Bromberg, & Newman, P.C., to take any and all appropriate action to obtain the aforementioned authorization from the Commissioner of Education and to effectuate same.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF \$240,000 FOR SEWER UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS FOR AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY AND, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$228,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the said Improvement there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$240,000, such sum includes the sum of \$12,000 as the down payment (the "Down Payment") required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"). The Down Payment is now available by virtue of provisions in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payments for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2:

In order to finance the cost of the Improvements not covered by application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$228,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$228,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Law").

SECTION 3:

(a) The Improvements authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is for the Ocean Avenue Sewer Relining Project to including relining of a 24" sewer main in the area of Imbrie Place, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto, and as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications on file with the Borough Clerk.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$228,000.

(c) The estimated cost of the Improvements is \$240,000 which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the Borough.

SECTION 4:

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 5:

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 6:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the Improvements, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$228,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$60,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

SECTION 7:

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purposes described in Section 3 of this Ordinance (including funds to be received from the Borough of Rumson pursuant to an agreement between the Borough of Rumson and the Borough which requires the reduction of the debt authorized herein based upon reimbursement of 50% of the costs) shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefor by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 8:

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 9:

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 10:

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be

incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$228,000.

SECTION 11:

This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Kelly stated that the town had a phenomenal summer and thanked all departments for doing an outstanding job, specifically the Police and Beach for keeping everyone safe and Public Works. The paid parking revenue was \$884,000, not including September's credit card revenue which is great. Highlands is hosting a Town Hall meeting on September 30th at 6:00pm to discuss school regionalization and we will be having a Town Hall meeting on October 29th at 7:00pm to discuss tax assessments. Progress on all other matters.

Councilman Bieber reported on behalf of the Flood Mitigation Committee, we continue to make good progress with the DOT for potential downtown bulkhead improvement efforts. Our next step is for the DOT to provide us any additional information that they think is necessary to move forward with a formal request and application to fund the project. After the election he plans to reach out to local politicians to gain their support for funding of the project.

Councilman Keeler stated that the Governing Body received an invitation to attend the 1st football game at Shore Regional on September 20th at 7:00pm (the first annual Mayor's Bowl) – he plans to attend. He also commended the Fire, First Aid, and Police Department for responding and assisting with a serious bike accident at Sandy Hook.

Councilwoman Gorman reported that there will be a Trunk or Treat, parade, and haunted house on October 26th. The farmer's market is still operating every Wednesday and once the weather changes it will be moved to inside the Community Center and may rotate to every other week. SeaCon will be taking place in the Community Center on September 21st -it is a great event for both adults and kids to explore comic books.

Councilman Leckstein reported from a code enforcement perspective they have been receiving complaints about the construction start time and the Police Department has addressed these concerns with the contractors. He also would like to take a look at the parking pass distribution policy. Councilman Bieber stated that when he came on to Council he did a comprehensive survey of the parking in the downtown. Councilman Leckstein would still like to take a further look into the policy for next year.
