WHEREAS, the only respondent available and capable to handle this project on an emergent basis was Pumping Services, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Administrator, Public Works Director and the Borough Engineer reviewed the proposal submitted by Pumping Services, Inc. in the amount of \$46,207.22 and determined it to be reasonable and appropriate for the scope of work to be performed; and

WHEREAS, Pumping Services, Inc. was prepared to immediately undertake the necessary improvements in order to correct the situation and minimize any additional deterioration of the system and protect the health and safety of the community at large; and

WHEREAS, NJ Local Public Contract Law 40A:11-6 permits the execution of an emergency contract by the Borough Administrator in accordance with certain circumstances and further identifies the process by which the Borough must follow to approve such contracts.

No. 194-2024 Authorizing a Shared Service Agreement with the Borough of Highlands for Municipal Court Services

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered the following Resolution for adoption; seconded by Councilmember Bieber:

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et. seq. allows a local unit to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide or receive any services that each local unit participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction, including services incidental to primary purposes of any of the participating local units; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1(c) allows two or more municipalities to provide jointly for courtrooms, chambers, equipment, supplies and employees for their municipal courts without establishing a joint municipal court; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright and the Borough of Highlands wish to encourage intermunicipal cooperation and are desirous of entering into a Shared Services Agreement for municipal court services; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Highlands and the Borough of Sea Bright find that it would be in the best interest of both municipalities to allow Sea Bright to utilize the Highlands Municipal Building's courtroom, court offices, and to share employees, facilities and equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright shall appoint a municipal judge to sit in its court, a municipal prosecutor and public defender.

WHEREAS, the term of the Shared Services Agreement shall commence on March 1, 2025 and shall continue for a period of three (3) years or until February 29, 2028; and

WHEREAS, for the use of the facilities and services provided, Sea Bright shall pay to Highlands the following amounts on or before the dates referenced:

March 1, 2025 - \$90,000.00 (for the one (1) year period through February 28, 2026) March 1, 2026 - \$91,800.00 (for the one (1) year period through February 28, 2027) March 1, 2027 - \$93,636.00 (for the one (1) year period through February 29, 2028)

No. 196-2024 Authorizing the Borough of Sea Bright Through The Sea Bright Police Department to Participate in The Defense Logistics Agency, Law Enforcement Support Office, 1033 Program to Enable the Sea Bright Police Department To Request And Acquire Excess Department of Defense Equipment

Councilmember Leckstein offered the following resolution and moved its adoption; seconded by Councilmember Bieber:

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAs to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that the Sea Bright Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for no more than a one-year period, with authorization to participate beginning January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sea Bright Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated "DEMIL A," which may include office supplies, office furniture, computers, electronic equipment, generators, field packs, non-military vehicles, clothing, traffic and transit signal systems, exercise equipment, farming and moving equipment, storage devices and containers, tools, medical and first aid equipment and supplies, personal protection equipment and supplies, construction materials, lighting supplies, beds and sleeping mats, wet and cold weather equipment and supplies, respirators, binoculars, and any other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified by the LEA, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes, based on the needs of the Sea Bright Police Department, without restriction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sea Bright Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire "DEMIL B through Q" property, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the "DEMIL B through Q'' controlled 3-page property list in its entirety is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sea Bright Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and policy for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sea Bright Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire "DEMIL A" property and "DEMIL B through Q" property that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; with Program participation and all property request authorization beginning January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025.

No. 199-2024 Resolution Confirming the Sale of \$1,095,000 General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024 of The Borough of Sea Bright, in The County of Monmouth, New Jersey to The Monmouth County Improvement Authority

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, the Borough adopted a resolution on November 18, 2024 (the "Authorization Resolution"), providing for the issuance and sale of bonds to The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,217,632 to be issued as one series designated as General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024 (collectively, the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Authorization Resolution, the terms of the Bonds shall be confirmed by the provisions set forth herein (the "Confirming Resolution").

The Bonds in the principal amount of \$1,095,000 are hereby issued and sold in accordance with the provisions of the Authorization Resolution and the provisions of this Confirming Resolution. The Bonds shall constitute and shall be designated "General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024".

SECTION 3. <u>Average Useful Life</u>. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes for which the said General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024 are to be issued, taking into consideration the amount of such General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024 to be issued for said improvements or purposes, is 11.41 years.

SECTION 4. Description of the Bonds.

(a) <u>Terms of the Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be dated and shall bear interest from the date of delivery at the rates, and shall mature, subject to prepayment as herein provided, on December 1 in the year and in the principal amount set opposite such year in the following table:

The Bonds shall be in substantially the form set forth in the Authorization Resolution, which form is by this reference incorporated in full as if set forth herein, with such omissions, insertions and variations as are properly required and which are not contrary to any of the provisions of the Authorization Resolution or any of the provisions of this Confirming Resolution.

SECTION 5. <u>Redemption of the Bonds</u>.

The Bonds maturing on or before December 1, 2034 shall not be subject to redemption prior to their respective maturity dates. The Bonds maturing on or after December 1, 2035 shall be subject to redemption prior to their respective maturity dates, on or after December 1, 2034 at the option of the Borough, upon notice as described in a bond resolution adopted by the Monmouth County Improvement Authority on October 10, 2024, either in whole or in part by lot within a single maturity from maturities selected by the Borough, on any date, at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof (the "Redemption Price") and accrued interest thereon to the date of redemption.

If notice of redemption has been given as provided herein, the Bonds or the portion thereof called for redemption shall be due and payable on the date fixed for redemption at the Redemption Price, together with accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

SECTION 6. <u>Award of the Bonds</u>. The Bonds are authorized to be sold and awarded to The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") at a purchase price of \$1,243,183.20 for the Bonds. The terms and conditions of such offer are set forth in a bond purchase agreement, dated December 4, 2024 (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"), a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and which by this reference is made a part hereof as if set forth in full herein. Settlement for the Bonds is expected to be made in immediately available funds on December 19, 2024.

SECTION 7. <u>Additional Acts</u>. On behalf of the Borough, the appropriate representatives of the Borough are authorized and directed to take all steps which are necessary or convenient to effectuate the terms of the Authorization Resolution and the terms of this Confirming Resolution with respect to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds.

SECTION 8. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Confirming Resolution shall take effect upon adoption hereof.
